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Teaching Philosophy

Curriculum

How is Honors Math different?

Honors Math instruction is different from standard grade-level instruction in a few ways.

- Increased opportunities for exploring concepts in real-world situations.
- Increased opportunities for written expression of mathematical reasoning.
- Higher expectations for mastery.
- Higher expectations for personal accountability.
- Pathway to High School Honors Math.

Required Materials

- 1. One 1.5 inch ClearView Binder (Math Notes and Handouts)
 - a. If combining classes, consider a 2 inch binder
- 2. One box of colored pencils or fine tip markers
- 3. Highlighter, any color
- 4. One black dry erase marker
- 5. Personal set of wired headphones

Classroom Rules

Grading

Math XL/IXL (Classwork)

Math XL/IXL assignments are due 5 school days before the end of the quarter. I do not deduct late points from Math XL/IXL assignments. Students cannot score below 90% on a Math XL/IXL assignment. IF the student scores below 90%, they will have to redo the assignment.

Homework

Any classwork not completed in the provided class time becomes homework.

Tests

Tests are open book and students may use their workbook, math notes, and any handouts I have provided to them.

Redo and Retake

Students are <u>required</u> to redo any Math XL/IXL assignment where they score below 90%. If a student has to redo an assignment, they have until 5 days before the end of the quarter to submit it. For a test, students will be provided the opportunity to redo/retake for the highest score they can achieve.

Classwork/Homework/Tests are NOT accepted after the cutoff date of 5 school days before the end of the quarter. NO exceptions.

Math Notes

Students are expected to keep a notebook with hand copied notes for each lesson. A template and example will be provided. Students are free to take notes in whatever format they choose as long as all information from the example is included. It is

important to keep these notes up to date because they can be used on Math XL/IXL assignments, homework, and tests.

Academic Integrity

I have a zero tolerance policy for cheating. Any student caught cheating will redo the assignment at lunch, receive a call home to parents, a BL-2 (30m detention), and be assigned a 1-page essay on academic integrity. This also applies to anyone assisting someone in cheating.

Absences and Missed Assignments

If a student is absent, it is their responsibility to check their grade level folder (on campus) and/or Google Classroom for missed work. They must also copy any notes that were missed.
